

REUSE OF PREVIOUSLY PUBLISHED MATERIAL Guidelines for Obtaining Permissions from Original Publisher —For Authors Submitting to AVS-Owned Journals

This document is a guide for use by authors who are submitting a manuscript to an AVS-OWNED JOURNAL. If you are including material that has been previously published (e.g., illustrations or tables), you may be required to obtain permission, from the ORIGINAL PUBLISHER, to reuse that material. In addition, you must include the proper CREDIT LINE within the figure/table caption of your submitted manuscript.

The responsibility for obtaining permission for reuse of previously published material rests with the AUTHOR; editors and staff of the AVS Journals cannot proxy for the author in this regard. It is the author's responsibility to include, in the submitted manuscript, the appropriate CREDIT LINES as outlined by the ORIGINAL PUBLISHER. **OBTAINING PERMISSION FROM THE ORIGINAL PUBLISHER MAY TAKE FROM 6 TO 8 WEEKS.** Contact the original publisher immediately upon deciding to include previously published material in your manuscript.

For previously published material, please follow the steps below:

STEP 1. Was the material published in a journal owned by the AVS? Although you do not need permission from AVS to reuse material for one AVS-owned journal that was previously published in another AVS-owned journal, you must include an appropriate CREDIT LINE, stating the original source. An example of the recommended CREDIT LINE appears below:

STEP 2. If the previously published material was not published in an AVS-owned journal, then check the Copyright Clearance Center's *Rightslink* Service to see if the Original Journal or Publisher is a participant. *Rightslink* is a convenient web-based method of obtaining permission to reuse material from a wide variety of participating publishers. Authors are encouraged to set up individual accounts with *Rightslink*; there is no charge to establish an account. A link to participating publishers may be found within the *Rightslink* web pages at <http://www.copyright.com>.

STEP 3. If the previously published material was not published in an AVS-owned journal and the Original Publisher is not a participant with *Rightslink*, then visit the Original Publisher's website to find their guidelines for permissions and online permissions request form. If you need to contact the Original Publisher via e-mail, mail, or fax, you may find a suggested request form on p. 2 of this document.

STEP 4. Obtain permission for reuse from the Original Publisher and include the appropriate CREDIT LINE in the figure or table caption, as instructed by the Original Publisher. A credit line of "Used with permission" is not sufficient. An example of a typical complete CREDIT LINE appears below:

In response to your request, the Original Publisher will provide you with their preferred wording for the CREDIT LINE (in most cases). Note that even when reusing material in the public domain (for which obtaining permission does **not** apply), you must include an appropriate CREDIT LINE, which states the original source. An example of an appropriate CREDIT LINE for material in the public domain follows: Reprinted from A. H. Harvey and J. C. Bellows, *Evaluation and Correlation of Steam Solubility Data for Salts and Minerals of Interest in the Power Industry*, NIST Technical Note 1387 (U.S. GPO, Washington, DC, 1997).
